




CLASS SIZE RESEARCH

MAXIMIZING YOUR SCHEDULE/FREE PLAY



Maximizing Your Schedule

- Identification of the necessary components of a kindergarten schedule.
- Planned integration of curricular areas.
- Recognition of how a kindergarten schedule changes across a school year.



Free Play in Kindergarten Schedules

- The AASD Kindergarten in the Common Core Era's Committee recommendation is that each kindergarten class schedule 20-30 minutes/day of Free Play.
- How Free Play is represented on a teacher's schedule will be building specific based on such factors as the master schedule/given blocks of time.
- Flexibility in scheduling is encouraged in recognition of how kindergarten classrooms adjust instruction to meet student needs across the school year.


